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PREFACE

Geographically, Jintur is a remote place far away from the metropolitan cities like Mumbai, Pune, Nasik and Aurangabad. It is settled among the hills and vallies in Parbhani district of Maharashtra State. It is a far flung taluka crowded with backward tribes. The major section in the population of the taluka comprises Nomads and other backward tribes which are identified as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Denotified Tribes and other minority communities. It has historical significance because there is a holy shrine of Neminath, the 19th Theerthankar of Jain religion. The word Jintur has been derived from the words **Jain – Pur**, to JINTUR, the place of Jainas.

The Parbhani district is recently declared as one of the backward districts of India by the Planning Commission. The UGC has also marked it as one of the most educationally backward districts of Maharashtra. Even 35 years after independence of India, Jintur was miles away from the facility of higher education. The students from well to do families managed to go to cities like Aurangabad, Nanded and Parbhani for higher education. Majority of the people, specially the underprivileged section of the society was deprived from higher education. In order to provide quality education for enlightenment of the rural, poor and socially derelict folk, the Dnyanopasak Shikshan Mandal, Parbhani started Arts and Commerce College at Jintur.

Dnyanopasak Shikshan Mandal was established in 1981 by certain idealistic, highly dynamic and dedicated people who have certain noble causes in their mind. Education to them is a tool of social change by which national harmony, peace and mental progress can be achieved. The mission of the Mandal is underlying in its name **Dnyanopasak** itself. **DNYANOPASAK** means the worshiper (devotee) of 'knowledge' thus the motto (statement of the aim) of the mandal is **'Let noble thoughts come to us from every side'**.

The Mandal prospered very soon and took its roots in Parbhani district. It had sown the seeds of Arts and Commerce College in the soil of Jintur in 1983. The college started with 59 students and 06 teachers in a wooden shed. In its earlier stage the college has managed its academic as well as administrative expenses without any financial aids from the Govt. of Maharashtra. The non-grant policy of the Govt. of Maharashtra (no-grants for seven years to newly opened college) has affected the progress and infrastructural development of the college.

Despite the financial crises the college has made tremendous progress. As the strength grew, consequently it was necessary for the college to construct classrooms, library building, administrative blocks and other structure. The college has started construction. Now it has its own specious building with 22 classrooms, 6 well equipped laboratories, Library hall, Staff room, Ladies room, Administrative blocks and other necessary structure.

Bearing in mind the importance of the knowledge of science in the rapidly changing globe, the Mandal had started Science stream in 1992. For the up-liftment of the unskilled and underprivileged rustic of this area the Mandal had started job oriented subjects like Computer Science, Electronics and Fishery Science.

In course of time the college has made quantitative and qualitative progress. Presently there are 18 full fledged departments having 39 members on teaching and 27 members on non-teaching staff. Out of 39 teachers 12 are Ph.D. holders and 14 are with M.Phil., 2 have submitted their doctoral dissertation and 3 are qualified with SET. Five teachers are actively engrossed in research work leading to Ph.D. They are catering the educational needs.

The establishment of the college has changed the entire atmosphere of the area. Within its life of 20 years, the college has catered the educational needs of the poor and oppressed rustics of this part and established its network of educational enlightenment.

The college is guided by a dynamic and dedicated educationist Adv. Shri Ganeshraoji Dudhagaonkar, Ex-Minister for Technical Education Govt. of Maharashtra., who is a man of principles with vision and ideas.

CRITERION WISE ANALYSIS

<u>Criterion I : Curricular Aspects:</u>

As the Dnyanopasak Shikshan Mandal's Arts, Commerce and Science College, Jintur is affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded, the curricula of Programmes offered by the college is framed by the various Boards of Studies constituted by the University. Taking into account of the educational needs of the society of the region and the nation in a wider sense the Dnyanopasak Shikshan Mandal has designed its Mission and Goals. The college has resolved to march onward in attainment of the mission and goals through the programmes offered by it.

In order to provide education for the enlightenment and intellectual advancement of the rural students the college has started knowledge based and skill oriented subjects.

To meet the needs of human resources and for overall progress of the society the college has started job oriented subjects like Computer Science, Electronic, Fishery Science, Banking, Insurance, Management, Transportation, Accountancy, Auditing, and Business Communication.

As a part of scheme of vocationalisation of education at first degree level, for self sufficiency, the college has started vocational subject Functional English for the students of faculty of Arts.

To achieve all round development of the personality of the student through the curriculum provided by the University the college has formulated certain programmes and co-curricular and extra curricular activities which can provide innumerable opportunities of personality development to students.

The College is committed to pursue excellence in higher education and to promote research on issues of social concern.

The teachers from the department of History, Political Science, Hindi, Business Administration & Mercantile Law and Business Economics are actively contributing as members of respective Board of Studies in framing the curricula. The curriculum prescribed by the University is discussed among the members of different departments. The syllabus is planed at micro level and the process of teaching learning is supplemented with new teaching technologies as per the goals and objectives of the institution. The programme options available at college level offer sufficient diversity and flexibility to the students.

The creative work of Shri. Indrajit Bhalerao, Head, Deptt. of Marathi, is prescribed as text books in different Universities in Maharashtra.

Dr. S.S. Kadam is member of Board of Studies Agricultural Engineering Faculty Marathwada Agricultural University, Parbhani.

One One act Play written by Shri V.S.Patil is prescribed as text book at UG level in S.R.T.Marathwada University Nanded.

The book written by Dr. P. M. Shinde, Head, Deptt. of Sociology, is prescribed as the text book at UG level in Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad.

The book written by Dr. A. T. Tawar, Deptt. of Economics, is prescribed as the text book at UG level in Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.

Criterion II : Teaching-Learning and Evaluation:

As Teaching-Learning and Evaluation is the basic function of the college, each and every teacher prepares a detailed teaching plan at the beginning of the academic year. For effective implementation of teaching plan every teacher maintains a teaching diary to record his/her day to day teaching items.

In order to make the process of teaching more effective and for proper comprehension of the students, the faculty widely makes use of teaching aids like maps, charts, overhead projector and audio-visuals aids. To encourage and activate students in pursuance of knowledge class - room seminars and group discussions are organized. The performance of the students is often tested through unit tests, assignments and terminal examination.

The department of English has established the language laboratory where lessons in spoken English with correct pronunciation, stress and intonation are given. The department has a very good collection of audio and videocassettes. The videocassettes of Shakespearian tragedies and comedies are available. The department often arranges the video shows of the plays of Shakespeare to the optional English as well as other students. The departments has initiated to provide remedial coaching to the disadvantaged students

The department of Marathi has also audio as well as video cassettes of poems of great poets like Shri.N.D.Mahanor,Shri Grace, and other. The video shows of the said cassettes are often arranged for the students.

The department of Computer Science and Electronics are also having advanced C.Ds. which are used as teaching aids.

As a part of faculty improvement programme, the teachers are encouraged to participate in Orientation and Refresher courses, as well as in various University, State, National and International level seminars, workshops, Symposia and conferences

The academic performance of the teachers is evaluated by the process of Self-Appraisal Report submitted by the teacher by the end of academic year.

The teachers' academic performance is also assessed through feed back received from the students. Some teachers are honored with prestigious awards for their academic achievements.

Apart from classroom teaching the process of teaching - learning is strengthened by educational tours, Symposia, Guest lectures and Science Exhibition. The Science laboratories, language laboratory, Computer center are important assets of the college.

In short, the emphasis of the college is on the improvement of the teaching learning process with evaluation methods.

Criterion III: Research, Consultancy and Extension:

Apart from the usual routine of transmission of knowledge to the students, it is fundamental duty of an institution to promote research culture among the students and teacher. Though the college has been running UG courses it often attempts to encourage research culture among the students and teacher. The majority of the teachers are actively engrossed in research activitirs. Out of Thirty-nine teachers, Twelve teachers have completed Ph.D., Fourteen have acquired M.Phil. and Eight teacher are actively engaged in research work. Two teachers have submitted their dissertation for Ph.D.They are given study leaves as and when required by them. Some of the teachers are regularly contributing research articles to State, National and International level research Journals.

A couple of years ago the Project Work was part of curricula of S.R.T. Marathwada University Nanded. The Final year students were supposed to write Project Work. Presently the final year students of Functional English, Computer Science and Commerce write project work as the partial fulfillment of requirement of the degree. The writing of project work is designed to allow the students to work independently on a given topic. They have to acquire independent and responsible study habit, collect and present information whose value must be judged.

Along with the transmission of formal education the college discharges certain extension activities. N.S.S. Unit, Nature club, Students' Welfare Committee, Science forum, Social Science forum and Department of Sports perform extension activities.

The activities like Blood donation, health and hygienic awareness camp, Tree plantation, AIDS awareness, Leprosy eradication programme, Learning license camp, Blood group testing camp are conducted by the college.

The Students' Welfare committee of the college, apart from guiding the students in getting financial support from different agencies, conducts different extension activities like eradication of superstitions eradication of leprosy pulse immunization tree plantation along with Gos and NGOs.

Criterion IV: Infrastructure and Learning Resources:

After possession of five acres of land from the Govt. of Maharashtra the college has prepared a Master Plan of the college building and other necessary structure. In the first phase of construction the college has constructed enough structure to accommodate class-rooms, well equipped laboratories, library, reading room, staff room, ladies' room, administrative blocks, different departments and guest rooms. There is enough space for different playgrounds, running track, botanical garden, vehicle shed and hostels. So far the college has developed playgrounds for different games, botanical garden, and running track. The facility of drinking water, electricity, Internet and telephone services are available on the college campus.

Despite easy access and book lending facilities available from 09.30 a.m. to 05.30 p.m, the facility of Night library from 07 p.m. to 10 p.m. is also available for students, where rare study material is kept. In order to cater the educational needs of the poor and needy students a Book-Bank facility is available in the college library.

The college proposes to construct auditorium, hostels and staff quarters in near in future.

Thus, the college has adequate infrastructure and enough teaching-learning resources in the terms of land, building, instruments, equipments at its disposal to meet the present needs. The attempts would be made to develop infrastructure along with academic growth.

Criterion V: Student Support and Progression.

The philosophy behind student support services is to help the students to overcome the barriers of learning. It is assumed that strong support services will help in the successful completion of a degree and to reduce the dropout rate. The college has adequate support services to provide necessary assistance to the students. The Student Welfare Committee is formed to provide guidance regarding various Scholarships of the State and Central Government. Out of 391 students 152 have obtained financial support from different agencies.

In order to improve the teaching-learning process college has prepared a format to get feed back through the students evaluation of a teacher. The Heads of different departments also take feed back from various academic activities. The policies and criteria for admission and other activities are reflected in the college prospects. The members of admission committee guide the student regarding their admissions.

Though the college has not established an independent Employment Cell, there is a Vocational Guidance Cell for the students. The consulting teachers provide information about the job opportunities, vacancies and advertisements. The Vocational Guidance Cell invites the experts from different fields to guide the students. In order to motivate the students for self-employment the college has arranged workshops in association with Parbhani District Co-Operative Board and M.C.E.D.

Alumni Association of college meets annually and shares thought and experiences. The association attempts to provide certain welfare facilities to the college for the students.

From the very beginning the college has attempted to conduct the examination in fair and healthy atmosphere without any unfair means and mal practices. The college is felicitated by the Vice-Chancellor of the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded, as the 'Ideal Examination Center' in its jurisdiction.

Dr. P.M.Shinde, Mr.B.B.Humbe, Dr. A.S.Kadam and Shri A.E. Jadhav are honored as ideal Joint Chief Superintendent by The Vice-Chancellor Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.

In leisure time the facility of indoor, outdoor games and reading room is available for recreation.

The college conducts the regular medical check up of the students. Though there is no appointed doctor in the health center of the college, the college full fills the requirement from the local doctors. The panel of local doctors is prepared on contract basis. As and when any emergency arises, the local doctors are invited to attend the patient the First Aid facility is available in the health center of the college.

Criterion VI : Organisation and Management

Planning and implementation are the two important functions of the management. The managing council of the Dnyanopasak Shikshan Mandal has set some aims and objectives before the administrative and academic staff of the college and administered responsibilities upon the authorities and the staff. For proper implementation of policies and internal coordination the Principal of the college has formed many committees like Academic Calendar, Admission, Time table, Library, Discipline and Sports.

The Academic Calendar Committee of the college, with the help of the academic calendar provided by the University, prepares academic calendar of the college taking into consideration of the local needs.

To check the work efficiency, quality of teaching - learning process and evaluation methods the Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been established. The IQAC attempts to maintain standardization of services provided by teaching, non-teaching and library staff.

The Exam Committee sets programme of tests, terminal exams and maintains the record of overall progress of the students.

To view the problems of employee and students with justice and understanding, to resolve disputes which arises in the day to day working of educational system, the Grievance Redressal Cell is there. It settles the disputes and grievances with discussion in a healthy atmosphere.

The Discipline Committee maintains discipline on the campus and keeps an eye on the transport services provided by the college bus.

The management organizes meetings with teaching and non-teaching staff and discusses on the new policies and programmes to be implemented by the college. The management often attempts to inculcate the ideas to improve the academic atmosphere.

Criterion VII : Healthy Practices

For smooth functioning of the college healthy atmosphere is essential, bearing this aspect in mind the college has adopted certain complementary schemes like **Teacher Guardian Scheme**, Dnyanopasak Lecture series, different forums, Consumer store etc.

In order to reduce the gap between the students and the teacher and to develop familiarity between them the Teacher-Guardian Scheme is implemented. Every teacher is allotted a limited number of students. He is supposed to keep contact with his / her parents and attempt to solve any problem and difficulties encountered by him / her.

Apart from class room teaching the students are exposed through Dnyanopasak Lecture Series. The annual social gathering, the cultural programmes, different games and sports strengthen the healthy atmosphere in the college.

In addition to these activities the college lecturers are encouraged to acquire additional qualification and academic knowledge for their academic enrichment.

As a part of Faculty Improvement Programme the teachers are encouraged to attend Orientation and Refresher Courses as well as regional, state, national and international level seminars, workshops and conferences.

Under the student welfare scheme Book-Bank facility, Night Library and different scholarships are available. The poor and needy students are given concession in their fees.

For Staff the Scheme of Group Insurance is implemented.

In order to cater the monitory needs of the staff at the hour of financial crises the Dnyanopasak Staff Credit Society provides loan easily and readily.

The college has facilitated the vehicle loan, housing loans from the local banks to staff.

To check the work efficiency and the quality of teaching learning and evaluation method **The Internal Quality Assurance** Cell is established.

To view the problems of employee and students with justice and understanding, to resolve disputes which arise in the day –to - day working of college a **Grievance Redressal Cell** is established in the college.

For women empowerment and to provide a stage to women a Women's Cell is established in the college.

To provide the general knowledge of legal matters and to highlight the consequences of the problems like ragging, dowry and child marriage **The Legal Literary Programmes** are conducted.

The Shiwar Sahitya Mandal established by college teachers organizes literary activities like poetry reciting, shorts story narration. The Sahitya Mandal also conducts symposias on recent trends in literature. Every year it honours one of the best poets in Maharashtra with **Rupali Dudgaonkar Paritosik** for his/her contribution to literature. The activities of Shiwar Sahitya Mandal provides good literally exposure to the rural students.

As a part of routine Medical check up of students the college has held a Blood Group Testing Camp for students. The blood group wise list

of the students has been prepared with their address. The said list is provided to the local Doctors. As and when any emergency arises the student of require blood group can be contacted to fulfill the requirement.

For the convenience of the student motor cyclists a learning license camp has been conducted in the college to issue the license.

SUMMARY

For effective implementation of teaching plan every teacher maintains a teaching diary. To encourage and activate students in pursuance of knowledge class room seminars, tests and terminal exams are conducted,

Along with the transmission of formal education the college discharges certain well-appreciated extension activities The NSS unit of the college provides innumerable opportunities of working with community. The social oriented programmes like Eradication of Superstitions and Blind beliefs, Leprosy Elimination, Pules Immunization, Blood Donation, Tree plantation, Watershed Management, Health and Hygienic awareness and AIDS Awareness are performed in collaboration with GOs and NGOs.

The library, which can be regarded as the backbone of the college, has extended valuable services to the students. It provides textbooks, reference books. Novels, short stories, periodicals and Journals to the students and the staff. Through its study center in the town it extends the service of Night-Library from 7.00 p.m. to 10,00 p.m.

to the needy and poor students. The Book-Bank facility provided by the library can be called an effective mobilization of its sources.

Apart from curricular activities many co-curricular and extra curricular and student-centered activities are performed through Literary Associations, Social Science forum, Commerce forum, Science forum and Nature club.

Though the college has not an independent Employment Cell, the Vocational guidance Cell is there to guide and provide information about job opportunities, vacancies and employment notification.

To view the problems of employee and students with justice and understanding, to resolve disputes which arise in the day-to-day working of educational system a Grievance Redressal cell is there. It settles the disputes and grievances with discussion in healthy atmosphere.

To check the work efficiency and the quality of teaching-learning and evaluation method Internal Quality Assurance cell has been established in the college.

For smooth functioning and effective implementation of programmes an internal co-ordinating and monitoring mechanism is in existence in the college. The Principal formulates various committees like Admission, Academic calendar, Time-table, Internal exams, Library, Discipline and Sports to assist him in day-to-day administration.

To accommodate the interests in the sports and games of the students the Department of Sports strives to provide the opportunities of games and sports to the students. It imparts training and practices of different games to the students and motivates them to participate in different tournaments held at different levels.

In order to motivate the creative faculty of the students eminent poets like Shri Indrajeet Bhalerao, Shri Vilas Patil and renown short story writer Shri Ganesh Awate are there in the college.

Along with these assets the Dnyanopasak Shikshan Mandal's Arts, Commerce and Science College, JINTUR is performing its divine duty of transmission of knowledge and wisdom on the Dnyangiri Campus.

SUMMARY

(Inputs from the Departments)

As the goal focus of the College is in providing rural youths an opportunity of personality development, the College has given priority to human resources.

Since, the teacher can mould and shape the students' academic as well as cultural aspects of personality, the College has recruited dynamic and dedicated teachers possessing multi-dimensional qualification. Due to hard work, total commitment and punctuality the academic ambiance of the College is maintained.

While considering the drop-out rate the College has basically considered the students those who have left the process of education and merged in another system i.e. got appointment, started some business or domestic life as house wife (in case of girls). Thus drop out rate mentioned here is 3 %.

The annual budget mentioned in 'Inputs from the Departments' under the point 27 is the budget sanctioned for Library requirements of the concerned departments. However, recurring and non-recurring laboratory expenditure is sanctioned by the Principal as per requirement of the department.

The inputs from the various departments are highlighted as follows:

DEPARTMENT OF MARATHI:

The department of Marathi offer Second Language to B.A. B.Com. and B.Sc. first year and second year courses. It has introduced optional Marathi at B.A. level. Presently the department is headed by Shir. Indrajeet Bhalerao, a renowned poet in Maharashtra. He has completed M.Phil and attended three refresher courses. He is a prolific poet. His many poetic collections are prescribed as text books at U.G. level in almost all Universities in Maharashtra. He had privilege of receiving " The Travelling Fellowship of Sahitya Academy, New Delhi. He has appointed as a member of jury to scrutinize the names of awardeese by Sahitya Academy, New Delhi and other many GOs and NGOs. He has actively participated in many State as well as National level conferences and presented poems. He has successfully discharged the work of University as examiner and paper-setter. For his contribution to literature. He has been felicitated with many awards (Paritoshik) by government and non government organisations.

Shri Vilas Patil is also a well known Poet. He has also completed his M.Phil and presently engaged in research work leading to Ph.D. His one of the poems is included in book complied by University and prescribed for study at P.G. level. One 'One Act Play' written by him is prescribed as text at U.G. level in S.R.T.M. University, Nanded. Under faculty improvement programme he has completed one orientation course and one refresher course. He has attended some state level conferences.

Shri Dhondge P.N. has passed M.Phil and SET examination. He has regisstered for Ph.D. and working on 'Saint Tukaram' a popular Poet of Maharashtra. He has also attended a State level seminar and a workshop.

Apart from his academic duties he works as a Journalism of 'Lokmat Daily'. He has awarded a 'State level Prize' for his contribution to Journalism.

The department of organizes many student centered activities. "The Marathi Literature Association" organizes many activities to promote creative faculty of students.

DEPARTMENT OF HINDI:

The Department of Hindi offers Second Language to B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. First as well as Second Year. The department has also introduced Hindi Optional at B.A. level. The Founder Head of the department was Dr. Ashok Jondhale who has been transferred to the D.S.M. College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Parbhani run by the same Mandal.

Presently the department is headed by Dr.S.L. Sadawarte. He has completed doctoral dissertation on the stories of '**Giriraj Kishore'**. He is recognized research guide and actively engaged in research activities. So far one candidate is awarded Ph.D. under his supervision and five scholars are working under his guidance.

Recently he is honored by "BHARAT VAIBHAV AWARD" By Inter nation Integrity and Peace and Friendship Council Delhi-2003. He is also felicitated by "Mother Teresa Excellency Award" from Front for National progress, Bengalore.

He has attended many state level as well as national level seminars and conferences. His book 'Kathakar Giriraj Kishore' is recommended as reference book in may Universities.

In addition to his academic achievements he has certain cultural merits. He is popular Singer. His programmes based on Bahinabaichi Gani, Meera Ke Bhajan and Mahadevi Varma's Poems are appreciated all over Maharshtra.

U.C. Jadhav has completed M.Phil on the Poems of 'Narendra Sharma'. Presently he is member of Board of Studies and 32/5 Committee of S.R.T.M. University, Nanded. He has attended two refresher courses and one orientation course. He has also attended many State level and National level seminars and conferences.

Shri S.S. Parihar is actively engaged in his work leading to Ph.D. He has also attended some State level as well as National level seminars and conferences.

To promote literary activities the department establishes Hindi Literary Association. The association organizes many literary activities and publishes Wall Papers regularly.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH :

The Department of English that has been established in 1983 offers compulsory English to B.A., B.Com. and B.Sc. first year as well as the second year classes. It has also introduced optional English at B.A. level. Along with

compulsory and optional English the department has introduced U.G.C. Vocational course in 1998 at B.A. level. To promote the academic skills and linguistic proficiency and to raise the level of comprehension of the students belonging to weaker section of the society, the department provides remedial coaching. The department has organized a One Day seminar on "First Year Optional English Text."

Shri. B.R.Pawar is the founder head of the department. He has completed his M.Phil. on novels of Mulk Raj Anand. He has attended four U.G.C.level workshops, Eight State level seminars and two National level conferences. He has presented a paper in state level seminar held on Indian English literature. In addition to these, under faculty improvement programme he has completed three refresher courses. He had an opportunity to co-ordinate "One Day Seminar". He has successfully discharged the work of University exams as Paper-setter, Moderator and examiner. For practical exams of Functional English he has worked as external as well internal examiner.

SUPPORT SERVICES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE

1. LIBRARY:

The library of the college, which is regarded as the backbone of the college has area of 1100 sq. ft. The total number of books available in the library is 18541. It is in the process of computerization and would be computerized soon. It has established linkage with libraries of D.S.M's College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Parbhani, D.S.M's Institutes of Information and Management, Parbhani, Govt. College of Education, Parbhani, Kamalatai Jamkar Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Parbhani for transaction of rare books as and when they are required by the respective colleges.

The reading room of the college is 607 sq. ft. At a time 50 students can utilize the facility of reading room. Thirty two Journals / Periodicals and 26 News papers in different languages are prescribed by the college library.

2. COMPUTER CENTER:

The college has a Computer Center which consists of five Pentium Machines with latest configuration. The computer center is connected with Internet facility. The center is open for the students and the staff. The center also consists of various Software like Windows 98, Office 2000 and Different language compilers. Besides the computer center the college has a computer laboratory.

3. LANGUAGE LABORATORY:

In order to supplement the teaching methodology the department of English has established a Language Laboratory.

In the Laboratory there is a good collection of Audio as well as Video Cassettes .Among the Video Cassettes some Cassettes are on the plays of William Shakespeare. The Audio Cassettes are on pronunciation and grammar. The Audio Video Aids are used to supplement the teaching.

4. SPORTS FACIITY:

The department of sports of the college provides the facility of couching as well as outdoor games like Hand Ball, Volley Ball, Kabbadi, Kho-Kho, Wrestling and Ball Badminton. The facility of indoor games like Chess, Carom are also available in the department. The Multi Gym is also open for students as well as for the staff. The ground of Hand Ball, Volley Ball, Kho-Kho, Kabbadi are excellent.

5. WELFARE SCHEMES:

In order to provide financial aids to the students many scholarships from central Govt. and State Govt. are available in the college. The students are benefited by the scholarships like National Merit, State Merit, Scholarship

for Physically Handicapped, Govt. of India scholarship, Primary teachers' as well as Secondary Teachers' children and Rajarshi Chatrapati Shahu Scholarship.

5 WOMEN'S CELL:

Women are regarded under privileged in the economic structure of rural India. They have been denied equal opportunities with men. Thus for women empowerment and to provide a stage to redress their rights the College has established a Women's Cell. The Cell highlights the problems and difficulties of women.

6. THE LEGAL LITERCY PROGRAMME:

Majority of the students who seek admission in this College are from near by villages. They have poor educational background. They don't have enough basic knowledge of legal matters. Though the fashion of ragging is not in practice in this area, the College feels that novices must have a general knowledge of legal matters. They must be acquainted with the laws regarding ragging, dowry, child marriage and other social problems. Thus in order to provide the general knowledge of legal matters the College provides to many lawyers and judges to deliver speeches on topic of legal relevance.

7. CONSUMER CO-OPERATIVE STORE:

In order to cater the needs of students and the staff the consumer co-operative store is being run in the college campus. It functions on co-operative basis. In the store notebooks, stationary, practical record books and some eatables are available on the cheaper rates.

8. DNYANOPASAK STAFF CO-OP. CREDIT SOCIETY:

In order to provide loans on the hour of needs the branch of Dnyanopasak Staff Credit Society is there in the college. Its head office is at Parbhani. It provides Term Loans, Salary Loan and Emergency Loan to the staff.

9. HEALTH CENTER:

In order to provide health services to the students and the staff the college runs a Health Center. Though there is no appointed doctor, the local doctors provide services on contract basis.

10. PUBLIC CALL PHONE FACILITY:

The facility of public call phone is made available in the collage campus. The students and staff use the service of telephone.

11. VEHICLE PARKING SHED:

The college provides the facility of vehicle parking shed to the students and employees of the college.

12. TRANSPORTATION SERVICE:

As the college is 4 kms away from the town, the college provides the facility of transportation to the students and staff. A bus is hired on contract basis and provides the service of transportation on cheaper rates.

13. CANTEEN:

For refreshment of the students and the staff there is a Canteen in the college campus. The canteen provides the services of refreshment on subsidized rates.

To impart scientific awareness and national values through practicals the branch of Maharashtra Vivek Vahini is establish in the College. The branch has attempted to eradicate superstitions among the tribal people (Andh). It also propagates scientific outlook.
