Introduction:

Since time immemorial up to 35 years after independence i.e. in 1983 the change in higher education came in the field of education in the form of Dnyanopasak Education Society. The Bhagirath who brought the Ganges of Knowledge to the earth from the Heaven is our Honourable Adv. Ganeshraoji Dudhgaonkar alias Bapusaheb, Member of Parliament of Parbhani constituency and Former State Minister for Higher and Technical Education, Government of Maharashtra. His enthusiastic and passionate personality brought an era of nectar for the educationally thirsty student community. The stream of science was commenced in 1992 revealing the backwardness of Jintur Taluka.

Jintur is the first Taluka in Maharashtra where Adv. Dudhagaonkar, Former Minister of State for Higher and Technical Education compelled to the Government to start government Polytechnic. He initiated the Ganges of knowledge in the form of the study of Science and Technology in this area. Students who come from remote villages and hilly areas of different tribes are considered as the soul of this educational institution.

Since its inception, the educational society had the vision to admit educationally backward and weaker students for their "up-liftment and rehabilitation for the rural students," instead of merit-oriented education. Because of all these efforts, having progressed and overcome all the obstacles "Dnyanopasak" became such a huge banyan tree in a short span of time that it influenced everybody in the vicinity to such an extent that many educational societies do not accept their existence, without affixing the word "knowledge." Dnyanopasak Education Society is the first institute to start computer science in the education sector of the Marathwada region.

<u>Junior College</u> <u>Faculty Of Arts</u> (XI & XII)

- 1. **Admission Eligibility: -** Students seeking admission in 11th Arts should have passed SSC examination with minimum 40% marks.
- 2. A student seeking admission in 12th Arts should have passed Standard 11th (Arts/Commerce/Science) from a government-recognized School/College. Students from other state must have passed A-2 level examination of the first year. They will have to submit a migration certificate.

Subject Groups: - For 11th and 12th Standard English is compulsory. A student can opt for Marathi/Pali/Hindi as a second language. A student seeking admission in 11th and 12th standard will have to select one of the following group of four subjects each.

Faculty Of Commerce (XI and XII)

Admission Criteria:-

- 1. Students seeking admission in XI Commerce should have passed SSC examination with at least 40% marks.
- 2. A student seeking admission XII commerce must have passed either XI standard (Com. &Sci.) If such an admission seeking/desiring student is from out of Maharashtra, (s) he must have passed an examination at A-2 level of junior college. The migration certificate is mandatory for such a non-Maharashtrian student.

Subjects: -A student getting enrolled for standard 11th and 12th will have to study English as compulsory subject and will have to opt for either Marathi or Hindi as a second language. Besides these (s) he will have to choose any four of the following optional subjects.

- 1. Economics
- 2. Book-keeping & Accountancy
- 3. Organisation of Commerce
- 4. Secretarial Practice or Co-Corporation.



Faculty Of Science (XI & XII)

Admission Eligibility:- (Eligibility for Admission):-

- 1. A student desirous to get enrolled in standard XI, should have an average 45% marks in SSC and a minimum of 40% marks in science. A student passing SSC with general mathematics cannot opt for mathematics.
- 2. A Student seeking admission in standard XII must have passed standard XI Science from any recognized school/college. A student who is, not domicile of Maharashtra must have passed the first-year exam of XI and XII science. English is compulsory and the candidate will have to choose either Marathi or Hindi as a second language, (s)he will have to choose any four subjects out of the following optional subjects.
 - 1. Physics,

- 2. Chemistry,
- 3. Biology/ Electronics,
- 4. Mathematics/Sociology/Crop Science.

Higher Secondary Vocational Course (XI & XII)

Admission Eligibility: - A student seeking admission in standard XI Higher Secondary Vocational course should have secured an average of 40% marks.

Course Syllabus: For the XI Higher Secondary Vocational Course English is compulsory and (s) he has to choose either Marathi or Hindi as a Second Language. Similarly General foundation is compulsory. Besides this one of the following subjects are to be chosen:

- 1. Electrical Technology
- 2. Banking Financial Resources and Insurance
- 3. Fisheries Technology Each of the above/subject offer 20 seats each.



Senior College **Faculty of Arts B.A. First Year**

Admission Eligibility: A Student seeking admission in B.A. First Year of senior college must have passed XII Arts, Commerce and Science or similar examination of Board of Secondary Higher Education.

Subjects: - English is compulsory for B.A. first year students; second language is chosen out of Marathi or Hindi. Besides these (s) he will have to opt for any three subjects from the following. All subjects should be selected as per CBCS pattern.

- 1. Marathi/Hindi/English
- 2. History/Sociology,
- 3. Political Science
- 4. Economics/Public Administration
- 5. Functional English (UGC Vocational functional English)

B.A. Second Year

Admission Eligibility: A Student, having passed B.A. F.Y. is eligible to be admitted to B.A.

Subjects: The subjects student selected for B.A. F.Y. would remain unchanged.

B.A. Third Year

Eligibility: Having passed B.A.S.Y., the student is eligible to the admitted to B.A. Third Year

Syllabus: Subjects/opted for B.A. S.Y. would remain constant.

Faculty of Commerce B.Com First Year

Admission Eligibility: Students desirous to be admitted to B.Com. First Year must have passed XII Commerce/Science or polytechnic examination. Non-domicile (out of State) Students, not-belonging to Maharashtra would submit migration certificate.

Admission Rules and Students Code of Conduct Rules of Admission Junior and Senior College

- 1. To seek admission a student should submit his duly signed application of registration in the prescribed format.
- 2. The admission application must be submitted in accompaniment with the following original documents along with their three photocopies each: A) Marks Memo, B) School/College Leaving Certificate, C) Income Certificate D) Caste Certificate E) Migration Certificate F) UID Adhar Card G) Voter ID
- 3. On the receipt of the admission registration application, they will be scrutinised, and a selection, based on the prescribed merit and reservation will be displayed on the list, A candidate would ensure his/her admission.
- 4. Students in the main list would enrol/admit within stipulated limit/notice/board. Students from the waiting list would be admitted later.
- 5. Non-Maharashtrian Students having passed HSC or university examination would submit the migration certificate within one month after their admission.
- 6. Students willing to readmission would pay the full fees at the time of admission.
- 7. A student willing to cancel his/her admission due to any reasons would submit a written application to the said effect in the office and pay full fees.
- 8. Before admitting to college, students should study all rules and regulation, opt for proper subjects and duly sign an admission form.
- 9. Students' admission is provisional and subject to a rules and regulations of the Department of Education, if the student would fail to follow rules and regulations, his admission would stand cancelled and the student would be solely accountable for his academic loss.

Important Notice

- 1. Admission desirous students would fill up an admission form in fair and legible hand and submit two pass port size photos along with the application.
- 2. After duly completing the admission process a students would pay identity card fee in the library and obtain identity card.
- 3. In case of changing a subject, faculty students should use prescribed application from the office. After the consent signature of the concerned college teacher and duly endorsed by the Principal the said application to be submitted to the office. The procedure of changing faculty or subject would be implemented. The change would be availed only once and students will be charged an amount for such facility
- 4. Any fee once paid would not be refunded at all
- 5. Students would abide code of conduct mentioned in the prospectus.



Ragging Prevention Ordinance

Ragging is a crime. Rising cases of ragging compelled the university grants commission in 2009 to issue an ordinance of severe punishment. An anti-ragging prevention and prohibition committee has been established in the university to implement the ordinance rigorously. Ragging is an inhuman and pervert conducts to torture/ harass fellow student physically and mentally. Ragging not only psychologically castrates an innocent student but even kills a student.

Ragging Consists of the following

- 1. To Rag newly admitted students: to tease verbally harass a new entrant emotionally or physically.
- 2. To behave with them in an insulting/humiliating and shameless and obscene way.
- **3.** To **harass** a new entrant by a senior, to bully, intimidate, threaten, terrorise, frighten which would cause harm to him.

Punishment for Ragging

The convict is punishable to any of the following punishment

- 1. Can be expelled from attending the classes and other educational benefits.
- 2. To strip off/ from any scholarship/fellowship.
- 3. Can be prohibited for appearing examination.
- 4. With holding result.
- 5. Prohibition from attending youth welfare.

Admission to Women's Hostel
